


# Places to visit in and around UDAIPUR



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### CITY PALACE

(11 km from hotel)


One of the architectural wonders of Rajasthan, City Palace in Udaipur is the largest palace complex of the state. The most popular sightseeing place in Udaipur, City Palace stands magnificently on the eastern banks of Lake Pichola. Flanked by the Aravali mountain range, City Palace is worth admiring for its natural settings that offer a breathtaking view of the surroundings.

#### LAKE PICHOLA

(11 km from hotel)

With dimensions of 3 miles in length, 2 miles in width and a depth of 30 feet, Lake Pichola has four main islands namely Jag Niwas, Jag Mandir, Mohan Mandir and Arsi Vilas.

The enchanting views of sunrise and sunset from the lake is something that should not be missed by anyone visiting the lake.






#### BAGORE KI HAVELI

(10 km from hotel)

Bagore ki Haveli is an opulent gracious palace which was built in the eighteenth century on the waterfront of Lake Pichola. Boasting of over a hundred rooms which have elaborate exhibits done up in mirror and glass works.

The highlight of the haveli is the popular Dharohar Dance Show that is held here every evening which showcases the culture and folk tradition of Rajasthan.



### JAG MANDIR

(11.5 km from hotel)

An exquisite palace that looks like a floating marble structure in a lake is a sight to behold as one visits the alluring Lake Pichola.

This palace known as Jagmandir or Jag Island Palace is located on the southern side of the lake and occupies the island with the same name known as Jag Island.

#### AMBRAI GHAT

(11 km from hotel)

Ambrai Ghat is one of the best and the most popular ghats in Udaipur. This place is filled with local people as well as tourists. In the early morning hours, you can find peace and solace with old citizens of Udaipur who do Yoga, bathe in lakes, and do several other activities. In the evening, you can enjoy the city lit with the lights.





#### OLD CITY MARKET

(9.5 km from hotel)

The shopping markets in Udaipur exclusively features handicrafts, pottery, jewellery, wooden toys, antique items, and paintings. The Old City Markey stands among the most-popular markets in the city for locals as well as tourists who are looking to buy craftworks, traditional clothing, and designer footwear such as Mojadis or juttis are the souls of this market.



#### JHEEL WATER PARK

(1.5 km from hotel)

Spread over an area of 2,25,000 sq. feet, Jeel Water Park is surrounded by Aravalli.



#### VINTAGE CAR MUSEUM

(9.5 km from hotel)

The luxury and grandiose lived and managed by the royal families of Udaipur is worth noticing. The museum showcases some of the most exquisite collection of royal antique cars which make it a heritage site, which is worth exploring.





#### Saheliyon ki Baari

(7.5 km from hotel)

Saheliyon Ki Bari also known as the Garden of Maidens, is a marvel of nature created for women. Garden of Maidens found in the Udaipur district of Rajasthan is a marvelous wonder of nature and its beauty designed with utmost care and perfection. The garden offers mesmerizing views of handsomely carved marble pavilions, kiosks in the pool, lotus pond and rain fountains.



#### KARNI MATA TEMPLE


(11 km from hotel)

Karni Mata Temple in Udaipur overlooks the city of lakes and the surrounding landscapes. While the temple itself is only small and modest, the view from the fort is one of the best sunset points in Udaipur. Located on the Machla Magra Hills, east of Lake Pichola, you can access the temple via a short hike or ropeway.

#### Sajjangarh Palace

(16 km from hotel)

Coming from the ravages of time, Sajjangarh Fort is a magnificent and stunning palace built on the Aravalli hilltop. Built-in 1884, the Sajjangarh Palace is a palatial residence of Maharana Sajjan Singh. The Palace overlooks a breathtaking view of the Lake Fateh Sagar, City Palace, and the King's ancestral home, Chittorgarh.





#### BADI LAKE

(13 km from hotel)

Badi Lake sprawls over a humongous area of 155 sq. km. Ideal as a popular picnic spot, Badi Lake also boasts of utter peace and tranquility as it is devoid of the regular tourist crowd. The lake is also ideal for a swim and there are several kiosks installed along the embankments which are meant for people to sit down and relax.



#### FATEH SAGAR LAKE

#### (8.5 km from hotel)

Lake Fatehsagar offers one of the most alluring qualities of water; the stillness of water reflects the tranquility of nature. The mesmerizing ripples, the crystal clear images give a quick peek into your soul. This soul-stirring effect of lakes makes it one of the best places to visit.

#### SHILPGRAM

#### (9 km from hotel)


Shilpgram is a one-of-its-kind living ethnographic museum that reflects that same culture and heritage, not only of Rajasthan but of entire West Zone. Inaugurated by Rajiv Gandhi way back in 1989, Shilpgram is a collaborative effort dedicated towards upholding and promoting the lifestyle, art and culture born in the nooks and crannies of rural and suburban parts of western India.



#### Jaisamand Lake

#### (63 km from hotel)

Spanning across an area of about 100 sq.km., Jaisamand Lake is the second largest artificial lake in the country after Govind Ballabh Pant Sagar. It is surrounded by the Jaisamand Wildlife Sanctuary which is home to a variety of rare animals and migratory birds. Situated in seamlessly beautiful surroundings, it is a place to rejoice. On its marble dam, there are six cenotaphs and a temple dedicated to Shiva at the centre.



#### Kumbhalgarh Fort

(78 km from hotel)

The fort that has made its mark in history as the second largest wall after the Great Wall of China – it is none but the Kumbhalgarh fort in Rajasthan. The mighty fort is 3600 ft tall and 38km long that surrounds the area of Udaipur. It was considered to have been built by Rana Kumbha in the 15th century.

#### **DELWARA**

(20 km from hotel)

Delwara is known as the 'Town of The Gods' simply because of the fact that the place has a high density of temples. It is evident that the town contains almost 2 to 3 temples in every street. Originally, it is said that Delwara had as many as a thousand temples





#### HALDIGHATI

(40 km from hotel)

The Haldighati region is situated in the Aravalli mountain range which links the Pali and Rajasamad districts in Rajasthan.

It is considered to be the pride of the Rajsamand district of Udaipur. The stellar role of Haldighati and its indifferent aura reminds us of the sacrifices made by the gallant warriors to protect the honor of the Rajputana kingdom.



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
